"Coming to college, I was really stressed about where my money would come from," Alexander says. "But Central has a lot of support for students and a lot of scholarship opportunities and ways to work on campus."

RECEIVE AND ACCEPT YOUR AID AWARD

We send financial aid awards — summarizing Central scholarships and awards, federal and state grants and federal loans — after we receive your student's FAFSA and your student participates in a Scholar Day. Return the accepted financial aid award and \$200 enrollment deposit no later than May 1.

\$7,500* IOWA TUITION GRANT

Students must reside in the state of lowa, attend a private college or university and demonstrate financial need as specified by the State of Iowa. Free Application for Federal Student Aid due to processor by July 1. Renewal is determined each year by filing the FAFSA.
